One of the more popular initiatives, directs us to "Run, Hide, Fight". If you are able to run away from the threat, do. If you cannot run away, hide. If you cannot hide, be prepared to fight – in any capac-



ity you can. The idea is to stall the perpetrator so that help can arrive. As reported from the recent incident in Dayton, emergency responders arrived within one minute of that 911 call.

Of course, we can all do our part to pray: for the 1<sup>st</sup> responders, for the victims, for the grieving family members, for those that are fearful,

As Christians, our favorite "coming attraction" might best be revealed in Revelation 1:1-7, which in part says (Rev. 1:3) **Blessed is the one who reads**

**aloud the words of this prophecy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it, because the time is near.** Although to be honest, that anticipated event is a little scary to think about too if you ask me. Why... maybe because we're concerned as to whether or not we have paid attention to those teachings of the Bible that come before Revelation.

Things like:

Starting in September, we will begin our efforts on behalf of Angel Tree children. We will receive a list of our "adopted" children and start making



plans to host a Christmas Party for those children here at Redeemer where we will deliver gifts to them from their incarcerated parents. The program is technically supposed to function along the lines of one child – one church member or family. I personally don't have any concerns about more than one family here at Redeemer participating in hosting a child. That doesn't mean that a child would get more than one gift but it would hopefully mean that there would be more people to share the joy with as far as making the event as much of a success as it could possibly be. Stand by for more information on this "coming attraction".

Another upcoming focus from your Deacon Board will be to see if we can develop an expanded role in a ministry we're supporting called Oasis House. Oasis House helps women and children (yes children) who have been victimized by the horrendous

"trafficking" activity that occurs across our nation



Those affected are fully as trapped as any of the incarcerated parents of the children we'll be working with as part of Angel Tree. Theirs is a prison without walls. Just read these statistics:

- The average age a teen enters the sex trade in the U.S. is 12 to 14-year-old. Many victims are runaway girls who were sexually abused as children.
- Human trafficking is the third largest international crime industry (behind illegal drugs and arms trafficking). It reportedly generates a profit of \$32 billion every year. Of that number, \$15.5 billion is made in industrialized countries.
- According to the U.S. State Department, 600,000 to 800,000 people are trafficked across international borders every year, of which 80% are female and half are children.

### WEDNESDAY NIGHT BOOK CLUB/BIBLE STUDY


